




Cougar (Puma concolor)

Cougar Mask Instructions

Supplies: Cougar face printouts, white/tan pipe cleaners, paint or Popsicle sticks, child-safe scissors, hole punchers, tape

- 1. Print the cougar face (Print this document double-sided if you wish to have the cougar track information print on the back of the cougar face as seen below).
- 2. Carefully cutout the cougar face with child safe scissors.
- 3. With hole punchers, punch out holes in the middle of the eyes so that you can see through the mask.
- 4. To make the whiskers, punch a hole on each side of the cougar's mouth, just below the nose. Thread two or three pipe cleaners through both holes so that they are even and create whiskers on both side of the cougar's face.
- 5. To make the handle for the mask, tape a paint or Popsicle stick to the back of the mask, securing it in place so that the mask can be held up by it.
- 6. **Optional:** As an alternative to putting a stick on the mask to allow it to be held up, tie yarn to the mask so that it can be worn hands-free. Additionally, children can color the mask with crayons or markers to add their own flare to it.
